Presidents Report

Once again another season has come & gone & we find ourselves half way through another winter. In reflection, another summer of consolidation both fronts, member & financially.

Our Junior section of the club, with the biggest section of members comparatively, continued in its growth more so in quality. This was shown out in the Clubs overall result at Oceans being the best ever on the New Zealand stage. Great to see a large number of ex clubbies have now moved from just bringing their children to nippers on Sunday & watching to now taking on positions of responsibility within this section.



Within the Senior section, patrolling has continued down the track of looking after another beach with Wenderholm being our second home. Like our other East Coast neighbours Red Beach & Mairangi Bay, patrolling on our home patch does not cut it any more so a wider scope of patrolling is now being entered into. This helps us with funding of extra equipment, profile within the community, & now being seen to be more mobile & a better community resource.

Sport will always be a mainstay of Lifesaving, this past season being no different with the club well represented at all events. The success of the introduction of a new coach to refresh the existing Senior ranks & concentrate on the inflow of members from Junior to Senior, with a bit more integration in the younger sector has been greeted by all & is set to continue.

Our building project which was publicized in the Local media in June continues through the resource consent process. With the creation of the Super City, another layer of bureaucracy has had to have been worked through. Prime concern has been our location in relation to future environmental effects. This has been referred to our Local Board & a decision on this is due early July. Next will be Resource consent application decision & along with Resource consent being notified.

Now that Ground Swell is a distant memory, Northern Region has reverted to the management structure of the past, with a voted Board now in place, a CEO & various staff aligned to New Zealand job descriptions & duties. Main focus is maintaining a status quo for funding from New Zealand SLS to Northern Region Clubs, maintaining current & growing new funding streams for the Region, management & delivery of programs & services to its members & continued development of relationships with Auckland Super City. With a number of staff changes, senior positions are now well established & a period of settled HR is now looked forward to.

From the resent fall from grace of our Parent Body, New Zealand SLS, it is pleasing that with the election of a new Board, an interim CEO & the recently appointed permanent CEO, it would appear that New Zealand SLS is now back on

track. Financially at break even, this forecast is said to be a reality for this past season. Some confidence can be gleaned from these points thus the phrase " back on track" could be well placed. A big wake up call for all of us in that we all must be watching & questioning those above.

With another season looming, work within our club & movement continues on. There never seems to be an off season anymore with many involved in reviewing & planning for the next. We carry on with no complaint knowing the more you put in, the more you get out.

A big thanks to our Sponsors, Business House Sponsors & supporters. Without your continued support we would not be.

To all of our Members, Committee members, Office Holders & Staff thank you all for you continued efforts, time & passion that you have given us this past season. Rest if you can & we will see you again on the sand.

Chairman's Report



Another successful season has drawn to a close with the club in good heart and looking to position itself for the future. There is a gradual and ongoing changing of the guard with some new officers, coach and a whole heap of new lifeguards.

We are very fortunate to have a big group of people willing to step up and take on roles within the club to make the club function for all members. On behalf of all our members I thank all of you who have helped out, whether it be as an officer, coach, on the BBQ, towing gear trailers, cleaning, water safety, etc. As I always say, if everyone does a little bit to help out then the club as a whole does well. The club is not one person or a small group – it is all of us.

We welcomed several new officers onto the club Executive Committee this year and we have a really good blend of experience and enthusiasm to lead us into the future. A couple of officers are retiring this year and I thank them for all their hard work.

Running a club with over 1000 members is no small job and we are very lucky to have the services of Heather Hilder to handle all our Administrative functions. She goes above and beyond the call of duty working hard on our behalf mostly behind the scenes.

Our life guards continued to provide a high quality lifeguarding service to the public and we extended our patrol services at Wenderholm over the peak holiday period. We plan to continue to expand these again next season. Tom Burgess (Club Captain) introduced some new ideas and initiatives which worked well.

Poor weather conditions for much of the summer meant that our incident statistics were down somewhat bucking the trend of recent years. Out of hours incidents continue to increase reflecting the "urban" setting of the beach. Our services are now required all year round and we need to be ready to respond to emergencies at any time.

We have had a big influx of new lifeguards coming into the senior ranks of the club from juniors and our Instructors have worked very hard to get these guys and girls qualified. Most of this effort is in the background but is probably the single most important job in the club ensuring that all our lifeguards are prepared for any emergency. I would particularly like to mention Dave Jenkinson our Chief Instructor who has lead a great team but is stepping down this year. Dave, thanks for all your hard work.

The Junior section of the club is in great heart with a solid core of experienced administrators and coaches ably led by Mark Fergus and Cam Lockie. It is always a pleasure to be at the club on a Sunday morning and see so many families enjoying the beach. We can't underestimate the importance of Junior Surf to the whole club as is evidenced by so many new life guards coming into the senior ranks.

Both our junior and senior members performed with credit in Surf Sports this year and their achievements are documented elsewhere in this report. Congratulations to everyone who competed in sport events and thanks to those who coached and managed teams at club and regional levels. Thanks too, to the parents etc who help as officials and water safety at various events.

We also welcomed a new coach this year in Chester Edwards, who while relatively young has proven a great asset to the club. We are pleased that Chester has accepted an offer to renew his contract for next year.

Money is always an issue for voluntary organisations. This year we tried to focus on seeking out new revenue streams to help the club after a couple of hard years through the recession and this has been quite successful meaning the club ended the year in a reasonably good financial position. Vickie Matich and Heather Hilder have worked really hard sourcing sponsorship and grant monies and Macca has headed a committee focusing specifically on generating more revenue for the club. This is really a thankless and unending task – but vital, so thanks to those that have worked in this area.

Special thanks to our sponsors, mentioned elsewhere in this report, at all levels, without whom we could not continue to function. We do appreciate your support.

The club lounge is an asset to the club and I would like to recognise Chris/Jess, Dianne and their staff who go out of their way to make the lounge a nice place to enjoy the club facilities which are their for all our benefit.

This year is historic for us in that we have our first ever Olympian in Teneale Hatton. Although she is competing in another sport, she developed her skills as a member of Orewa SLSC. Anyone who knows Teneale knows how hard she has worked over many years to make it to the Olympics. On behalf of the club, and personally, I wish Teneale all the best and I know all our members will be supporting her.

As I write this the winners of the annual regional and national Awards of Excellence have not been named, but Orewa is well represented amongst the finalists. Good luck to everyone nominated.

Wayne Franich is being recognised for his commitment to Surf Life Saving by being awarded a Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Northern Region. This is well deserved and recognises Wayne's contribution to our club and surf lifesaving nationally for over 30 years. Congratulations Wayne.

Nationally Surf Lifesaving has undergone some major changes and challenges this year but I think is well positioned to move ahead in coming years. Northern Region has been reconstituted and acts as an integrated but autonomous part of Surf Life Saving New Zealand. There is a huge amount of work done at regional and national levels and Orewa has a number of members actively working at these levels for the benefit of Surf Life Saving in a wider sense.

Next season promises to be another good year and we hope to build on the best parts of this year. Looming large on the horizon is the redevelopment of our building which we hope will be a reality soon.

Unfortunately a lot of the patrolling hours still fell to a few individuals, who spent nearly 100 hours of vigilance with the sand between their toes. Next season there will be more courses for first aid, Powercraft and leadership, so make it known where your club can take you further.

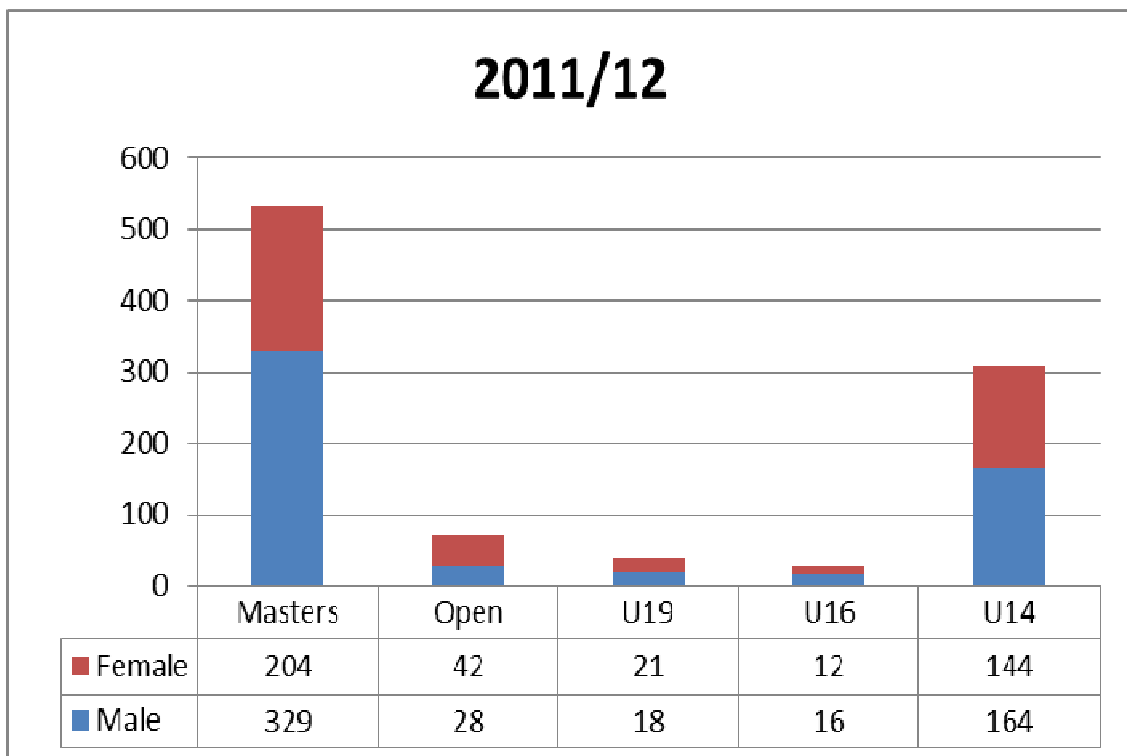


This season saw more patrolling at Wendeholm this summer holiday period. For the three weeks that were patrolled there, club members patrolled with minimal equipment with limited shelter, something not ideal for the summer we had. However, we managed to remain busy, dealing with some serious first aids and during one day it was the busiest beach in Northern Region. With this in mind we will be patrolling there next season, but we are looking at being better resourced and having better shelter there. Providing this service to the community is very important to us and expanding this provision is going to help us massively with our future funding.

There has been more spent this year on repairs of our lifesaving equipment than previous seasons. It is not because we engaging in more use of it, but that we are taking less care and focusing less on the easy maintenance and care that can be undertaken during our daily use. What this means is that we are paying more seasonally for the damage that is caused as well as struggling to meet the minimum requirements to be able to patrol. What is needed from the membership is honesty and respect, as when people take the time to perform simple checks and use things sensibly there is less chance of breakages. When they still happen, if they are reported promptly, we can swiftly action repairs and minimise the impact on providing our services.

Storage has become more of an issue for our club, with more people, more equipment and no more space. The committees will be undertaking some changes over the winter months to try and use the space that we have more effectively, whilst still working toward our goal of building a new club house. Having not been on the executive committee previously, I have not been privy to a lot of information on our progression of a new building. From this, I know now, that there are some people working tirelessly towards its completion and they must be commended for their patience in what seems like an endless project.

Chief Instructor's Report

Surf Lifeguard Award

A healthy increase in lifeguards this season saw 28 candidates gain their Surf Lifeguard Award. Our end of season patrol list now stands at 126 patrolling members.

All but 2 of our new lifeguards are under the age of 20, and 16 candidates came through directly from the Rookie program. Despite regular advertising, we are still not able to get Nipper parents interested in becoming lifeguards. A new strategy is required here.



Study and work commitments reduced our availability of instructors over the season. Winter training was successfully capped off at the October 29th exam. Mark Johnston and Nick Tomkins worked hard to get another set of candidates through in the latter part of the season.

Next season we will explore creating a mixed training program which includes a team taught intensive weekends perhaps including candidates and instructors

from Red Beach. This will hopefully create a more varied and engaging training experience and reduce the total amount of training hours required per candidate.

Thanks to Keri James at Lifesaving First Aid for arranging training sessions and thanks again to Orewa College for providing us with an ideal training venue at no cost.

- Work to qualify all new lifeguards in First Aid Level 1 within their first season,
- Look to add another 4 PHEC

Other qualifications/activities

Youth Development Camp

Intermediate Guard School

Drue Matich and Ben Parker attended the Bethell's Beach Intermediate Guard school this season. We do need more of our patrolling members to attend this course to build capability and confidence.

Patrol Captain's course

No members attended the course this season. This is a valuable course for all PC's and VPC's and therefore all should be encouraged to attend.

Board Rescue module

Two board rescue modules sessions were held this season however there was a disappointing lack of interest from the patrolling members to gain some valuable rescue skills that are very relevant to our beach. Maybe the new Starboard from SUP NZ will ignite a little more interest!

Orewa's lifeguarding skill base is at a healthy level. With even more courses, qualifications and training options available to members it should continue to build steadily with the right marketing and encouragement from senior members and patrol captains.

The 2011-2012 season has been a year of rebuilding for Orewa. From the first few weeks of the season it was clear there were a bunch of talented athletes to work with as well as a strong base of juniors coming up through the ranks. As coach, the focus was to get to know everyone and provide good quality, varied sessions for a range of club members. The season has provided the knowledge of what to do in the coming years to succeed as a club in competition. Listed below are a few highlights and successes from the 2011-2012 season.

- In mid October 2011 we ran a camp at Waipu Cove. We had good attendance and developed some great team spirit
- We gained some excellent results in the early carnivals achieving 1st place in the King of Rangitoto Open Men's, Open Women's and U19 men's division. We had a good turn out at the long distance carnival and came 2nd on points in both the 1st and 2nd Northern Region Carnivals.

- We had a large representation in the Auckland Surf League Team. Congratulations to Michayla Johnston, Cole Drinnan, Adam Parker, Jarrod Olsen, Jack Wilson, Andrew Saunders and Rachel Clarke.

- We had an excellent running/sprinting programme thanks to Peter Young. Those that regularly attended these sessions saw a significant improvement in running technique, strength and speed.
- Taking a team to the Gold Coast for the Australian Titles was a great team trip, both to gain experience and for social development. We came away with two silver medal in the Open Mens and Womens 2 km beach run. Nicole Rosewarne finished 11th in the U17 Womens Surf Race and Jack Wilson finished 6th in the U19 Mens Ski Race. Making a final in Australia is a huge achievement!

At the Nationals, ERC's and NRC's we finished 11th, 9th and 3rd respectively. There were some outstanding individual and team performances. To climb the ladder we need a larger competition squad which has started by retaining the junior members coming through to the seniors. We also have a shortage of swimmers in the club. Specific summer swim sessions and recruitment is needed to increase the number of swimmers. Putting canoe crews together and getting them to the regional events is another necessity.

The team spirit and social interaction amongst our members is a key to our success and enjoyment as a club. This will continue to be a focus and social gatherings will be encouraged.



To finish off I would like to thank everyone who has helped with my first year at Orewa. You have all made me feel welcome and given great advice and support when needed. 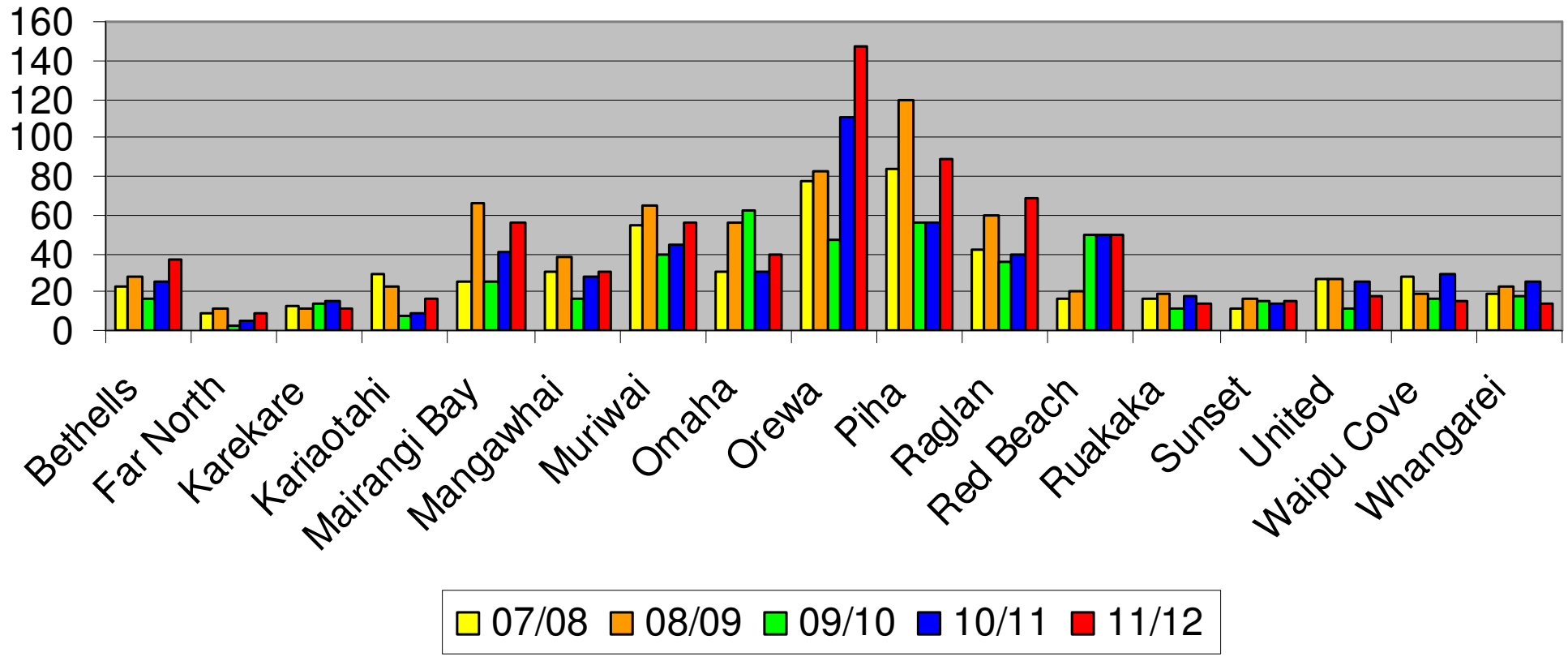
Orewa's Historical Patrolling Statistics



Northern Region Rescue Stats



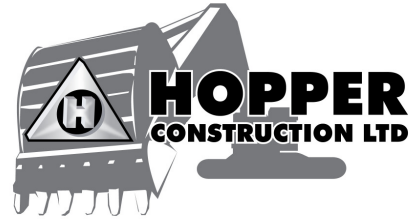
