Club Captain's Report

Patrolling this season had considerably more patrols, with smaller teams, with patrols teaming up to deliver patrols at Orewa and Wenderholm. Unfortunately a lot of the patrolling hours still fell to a few individuals, who spent nearly 100 hours of vigilance with the sand between their toes.



This season saw more patrolling at Wenderholm, with a Regional Lifeguard Service being provided there for three weeks of the Summer holiday period. Our volunteer weekends were extended from 3 to 5, although the number of days that volunteers patrolled was the same due to RLS cover on Christmas Day and New Year's Day. The equipment used at Wenderholm was improved, and this year saw a tent place there as well as improvements to all of the equipment available to lifeguards. Next year hopes to see this taken even further. Providing this service to the community is very important to us and expanding this provision is going to help us massively with our future funding.

As we grow we find there is less and less space available at the club and we are having to use the space we have more wisely. There are some people working tirelessly towards our new building project and they must be commended for their patience in what seems like an endless process. However, as we try to fit more equipment into smaller spaces, damage inevitably occurs, but members having pride in the club and the equipment we use means we take more care. In the coming season as we grow further, we need to help our younger members learn and understand this which is something I feel is starting to be lost. Our responsibility as a club is not just to educate children in safety, provide lifesaving services and compete, we also must teach life skills, leadership and values for our members to excel in all aspects of their lives and communities beyond our own to benefit from them as people.

Surf Lifeguard Award

An increase in lifeguards this season saw 25 candidates gain their Surf Lifeguard Award. Rounding off the 2012/2013 season patrol lists with 123 patrolling members. Study and work commitments reduced the availability of instructors over the season. Winter training kicked off later than anticipated but was successfully capped off at the December the 16th exam. Mark Johnston and Nick Tomkins worked hard to get this set of candidates qualified.

With the second set of candidates in the New Year, we explored a mixed training program which included a team teaching program. This was designed to shift the work load from any one instructor and to capitalise on the wealth of expertise in the club to ensure the candidates were prepared to the best standard for their Surf Lifeguard Assessment.

- Qualify at least another 6 candidates in IRB Crew and IRB Drivers Awards
- Qualify one more IRB instructor.
- Qualify one more IRB Examiner.

First Aid

The numbers qualified for First Aid are healthy at all levels (FA1 = 8, FA2 = 5, & FA3 PHEC = 11). Added to this, we had 3 members attend the new Pain Management Module which trains PHEC level lifeguards in the administration of Methoxyflurane and Paracetamol.

Thanks to Keri James at Lifesaving First Aid for arranging training sessions and thanks again to Orewa College for providing us with an ideal training venue at no cost.

Goals for 2013/14 season;

- Work to qualify all new lifeguards in First Aid Level 1 within their first season,
- Look to add another 4 PHEC

Summary

Orewa's lifeguarding skill base is at a healthy level. With even more courses, qualifications and training options available to members it should continue to build steadily with the right marketing and encouragement from senior members and patrol captains.
