

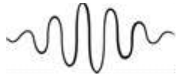

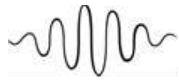

I do want to mention the club's senior management team who put in a huge amount of work off the beach to ensure the smooth running of the various activities of the club.

This equated to over 6 months of volunteer patrolling! As a club this puts a significant strain upon some key members in our club. Those who are IRB operators, instructors and examiners gave more than just their patrolling time to keeping our service to the high standard our community expects.

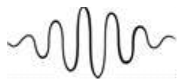
Our lifeguards are held in the highest regard with SLS and this lead us to being called upon to assist in flood rescue up near Wellsford, delivering event safety for events and winning a national rescue of the month. That rescue was a fantastic culmination of our regional lifeguards and volunteer lifeguards working together to ensure the safety of a group of children. Without the intervention of lifeguards that day, at least one life would certainly have been lost, and for that we are grateful for their National recognition. Whilst we may sometimes get complacent upon the safety of our beach, we must remember that we do not always need waves for people to get into difficulty.

Next season we will need more people to train up and get involved in the club if we are to continue to expand our service to our local community, so please think about what you want to do next Summer!

Surf Sports Report

With another surf sports season over its time to reflect on what has been a successful summer for Orewa.

We started the year with a new head coach with direction around the inclusion of everyone no matter their ability or motivation, while there are still some tweaking to be done, I believe we are on the right direction and this year's results confirm this. A full review was carried out at the end of the this season where we went through lessons learnt as well as setting targets with retention and providing an environment where everybody gets what they want out of the sport section.

If we look at pure results from last season to this we have achieved this, the senior team in particular having huge improvement, with the highlights below.

NRC 12/13 season we won 31 Medals but increased this past season to 64 medals.

ERC 12/13 season we won 11 Medals increasing this to 20 this past season.

Nationals 12/13 season we won 3 medals this year we won 14 medals including 5 gold's.

Nationals saw Orewa go from 26th overall to 8th this year. This is something the senior team can be proud of.

While the past season has been a successful one on the water there remains a number of issues we as a committee need to address. We need to replace both of our competing boats over the next 2 years, a new Canoe will need to be purchased if the growth in this area continues as well as new skis and Boards.

This of course takes money and with all clubs chasing the sponsorship dollar this takes time and commitment by volunteers who make this club tick.

While as a club we are seeing steady growth, surf sports as a whole needs be thinking overall and challenging ourselves just as other sports are doing, there is a general trend of declining numbers playing organised sport with an increase in casual sport and people doing sport on their own such as Triathlon or running. Experts are telling us this is due to people having less time to commit to a set time each week and the changing makeup of the population. Major sports are all developing a casual arm to their main sport, with Rugby, Cricket and AFL currently doing this, something that surf sports will need to address in the future.

Junior Surf Report

What an amazing season we've had. An incredible summer with sunny Sunday mornings (only one that rained) I can't recall another season like it. Even Northern Region Junior Champs were sunny with no wind. Due to this the membership retention was at the greatest it ever been. The normal number of drop offs were significantly reduced as kids remained engaged and eager to participate on the sunny Sunday mornings.

The Junior committee has worked hard to reinforce within the Orewa community as a family friendly club. Through school visits, recognition of sponsorships, and proactive engagement of parents to the wider cause of the club, we have had an increase of 42% in membership numbers. This can be seen as follows.

We have enjoyed a higher number of expressions of interest from Junior parents for coaching and official courses as a result of in-house education at younger age group levels. This has been achieved through early education to new club members and parents.

We have identified our next key area of development in Junior surf, that being the support and implementation of a tangible succession plan for coaches and managers moving through the Age groups. This commenced with the Coaches of the 5-6 year olds for the 13/14 season. The result is a fully engaged and developed coaching team for A Group for the 2015 season.

We have built on our focus of building core safety skills within our membership, with an unprecedented number of A group achieving their 200m patch this past season – 62 in total. We have also embraced the Northern Region Education Framework to recognise the milestones that our junior members achieve as they move towards their goal of being a lifeguard. 48 juniors received their Junior surf achievement certificates this season.

- 4 children achieved Level 4
- 22 children achieved Level 3
- 18 children achieved Level 2
- 13 children achieved Level 1

We have also had a very successful season in the sport arena. These can be summarised as:

- Increase in Oceans 14 Team Numbers - 20 boys & 18 girls 2012-2013, 27 boys & 22 girls at Oceans 2014
- Oceans 14 – 6 golds, 5 silvers, 1 bronze – 6th overall.
- Over 120 participated in the Northern Regional Junior Champs
- 25 gold, 19 silver, 21 bronzes – 3rd overall
- 3rd – Cath and Eddie Millar Cup (A group placing First, C group placing 3rd)
- Lucy Makaea (under 13 girls) won the twilight series for the season
- Xander Cuff and Lucy Makaea both finalists in the Under 14 Sports person of the Year Award at the Northern Region Awards of Excellence.



The Junior committee has continued building on its successful fundraising activities delivering again the Season Welcome beach party, Quiz night, weekly BBQ, and the catering for the Northern Regional Junior Age group Champs, and bar coordination for the Senior prize giving. And continue to look for new and innovative ways to support and fund our growing membership and increasing role within the community.

We are incredibly proud of our Junior Camp, and this year was no exception. The participation, involvement and fun enjoyed by all, symbolises our approach to the junior surf programme. We look forward to another successful camp in 2015.

SLSNR & SLSNZ Rescue of the Month Award– January 2014

Just before 5pm whilst James Campbell was on observation duties in the club tower, he noticed 4 people that looked (by binoculars) to be in distress at the South end of Orewa Beach. After speaking to the Patrol Captain Nick Tomkins on the radio, James left the club and travelled by quad to the South end of the beach with the intention to swim out and offer assistance to those 4 in the water if required.

Travis Salahub went to keep watch from the clubhouse in case support was needed due to the numbers involved and the location of the incident. By binoculars Travis could see the 4 swimmers, who were now a good distance from shore. After a quick conversation with Nick they enlisted the help of off duty Lifeguard Pierre to assist in beach and incident management and then launched the IRB.

When James arrived on scene by the estuary he could see could see a patient waving frantically. He waded out to the boy and although the patient was in emotional distress was able to make his own way out of the water. James could now see clearly the second and third patients, so he swam out to assist them but from this low angle could not see the fourth person that he had previously seen from the club. When he reached the second person, she informed him that she could not swim and grabbed the rescue tube. He continued swimming out to sea to the next patient who was unable to speak due to exhaustion.

Travis and Nick then arrived on scene in the IRB and on approaching James, were informed the last swimmer was somewhere further out to sea. They located her and she was floating face down - lifeless. Travis exited the IRB, rolled the patient over and secured her airway. She appeared to have no signs of breathing, was grey in colour and completely unconscious. Once she was pulled from the water into the IRB they headed straight to the beach to treat her.

Pierre who had been observing from the club recognised the seriousness of the situation, collected a radio and made his way onto the beach where he found Mark McCarthy and they drove by truck to meet the IRB with the oxygen kit.

The young girl was carried from the IRB and assessed by the lifeguards. Whilst awaiting the setup of the oxygen equipment, they cleared and maintained her airway, where signs of breathing became evident. She was then placed on oxygen and monitored.

Whilst Pierre, Travis, Nick and Jodie managed the care of the unconscious girl, Mark launched the IRB solo and proceeded out to retrieve James and the remaining patients who were still secured in the rescue tube and were now on the opposite side of the fast flowing current.

At 5:32pm the first Ambulance arrived on scene. All patients were transported back to the club by truck, and the girl who was pulled unconscious by the IRB Crew was quickly re-assessed and then transported with urgency to Starship Hospital, now breathing and conscious - responsive to voice where she was placed on a ventilator through the night (status 2).

After being triaged by Jodie Woods and an Advanced Paramedic, the three remaining patients were also transported to hospital for observation by the second ambulance. All remaining patients were conscious and alert (status 4), but continued to show emotional distress.

Without the swift intervention of the lifeguards and their management of the patients, one or more lives could easily have been lost.
